TOOLS

- ☐ Sewing machine and thread
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Quilting ruler (plus a 6½" square ruler for trimming)
- Pencil or preferred marking tool
- Pins
- Iron
- Snips / small scissors
- Preferred basting tools (i.e. thread, spray glue, or curved pins)

Be Mine Quilt

FINISHED SIZE: Approx. 60" x 54"

MATERIALS

☐ Background Fabric

- 2 yards (Cream)
- ☐ Colored Fabrics

SINGLE COLOR VERSION

• 1¼ yards

RAINBOW VERSION

• 8 Fat Quarters*

(You will not use the whole fat quarter for some colors. The actual amounts are shown in the cutting instructions - you may also be able to use smaller pieces from your stash.)

- ☐ Backing Fabric
 - 3½ yards
- ☐ Binding Fabric
 - ½ yard
- □ Batting
 - Twin size (or 134 yards if a minimum of 70" wide from the roll)

CUTTING

FROM THE CREAM FABRIC, CUT:

- 6 (7" x 42") strips. From strips, cut 33 (7") squares.
- $4(6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42") strips. From strips, cut 24 (6½") squares.

FROM THE BINDING FABRIC, CUT:

• 6 (2½" x 42") strips

Single Color Version

FROM THE COLORED FABRIC, CUT:

• 6 (7" x 42") strips. From strips cut 33 (7") squares.

Rainbow Version

FROM THE YELLOW FABRIC, CUT:

• 2 (7") squares.

FROM THE ORANGE FABRIC. CUT:

• 3 (7") squares.

FROM THE LIGHT PINK FABRIC, CUT:

• 4 (7") squares.

FROM THE DARK PINK FABRIC, CUT:

• 4 (7") squares.

FROM THE PURPLE FABRIC, CUT:

• 5 (7") squares.

FROM THE LIGHT BLUE FABRIC, CUT:

• 5 (7") squares.

FROM THE DARK BLUE FABRIC, CUT:

• 5 (7") squares.


FROM THE GREEN FABRIC, CUT:


• 5 (7") squares.

Making the half-square triangle (HST) units

- 1. Place a background (7") square on a colored (7") square right sides together aligning the raw edges. Using a fine pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the background square.
- 2. Sew a ¼" seam on either side of the drawn line from Step 1, creating two seams. Cut along the drawn line. Press the seam towards the colored fabric.








MAKE 66

- **3.** Repeat Steps 1 2 with the remaining pairs of (7") squares to make a total of 66 half square triangle (HST) units.
- **4.** Trim all HST units to 6½" square.

Quilt assembly


- 1. Referencing the diagram on the left, arrange the blocks on a design wall or other flat surface. Use a photo of the layout for reference when joining the rows.
- 2. Pin and sew together the first row and press the seams to the left.
- 3. Pin and sew together the second row and press the seams to the right.
- **4.** Continue joining the rows, pressing alternately to the left and right.
- **5.** Pin and sew the rows together, nesting the seams. Press the seams downwards.


Finishing the quilt

- 1. Layer the backing, wrong side up; batting; and quilt top, right side up. Baste using desired method.
- 2. Quilt in a simple grid, or following the HSTs in a V formation as shown on the example, or any pattern you desire.
- **3.** Machine sew the binding to the quilt on the right side, and finish by hand on the wrong side.
